



**D**uring the 1990s, Jim Costeloe wrote a weekly column, under the pseudonym 'The Scribe of Asdee', for the Cork regional paper, *The Cork Star*, and for the Limerick regional paper, *The Weekly Observer*. These columns consisted of his reminiscences of his early years in Asdee and form the basis for *Asdee in the 1940s and '50s - A Rural Miscellany*. In his writing, Jim describes the full panoply of rural life in north Kerry in that period. He writes with an honesty that allows the reader see life then as it truly was.

While he has no sentimentality about past days, Jim displays a deep affection for his native home and especially for the people who were vital in making a hard life not just bearable, but something to be cherished and remembered with love. The ties that bound the people of Asdee and the wider north Kerry area to each other in the 1940s and '50s are brought to life in this book with great clarity, humour and affection.

# ASDEE IN THE 1940s AND '50s *A Rural Miscellany*



Jim Costeloe was born in 1933 in Asdee in north Kerry and grew up in what was known as the Blenned Dell between with his siblings and parents, Ned and Minnie. He attended the local national school until the age of fifteen. In 1954 he undertook the Garda entrance exam in which he was awarded second place in Ireland. This was a significant achievement considering most of the other candidates had completed the Leaving Certificate in advance of sitting the exam. He attended training at the Garda Depot in the Phoenix Park in Dublin from April 1955 until September 1956.

Although not a native Irish speaker, Jim was posted to two Gaeltacht stations - Dugort and Spiddal in County Galway - from 1956 to 1959. It was during this time that he was first called 'Seamus', the name by which he is now known. He was posted to Gortlucy in County Limerick where he worked until 1960. From 1960, he was stationed in Hospital, County Limerick, until he retired in 1995. He married Margaret in 1964 and they had three children.
